4. Emergency Procedures

- First Aid: A fully stocked first aid kit will be available at all sessions.
- Emergency Contact: The session leader will have a mobile phone and access to all members' emergency contact details.
- Accident Reporting: All accidents, no matter how minor, must be recorded in the club's accident book.

• **Evacuation:** In the event of a fire alarm or other emergency, all players must follow the established **Taunton School evacuation procedure** and meet at the designated assembly point. The session leader will be responsible for a head count.
